STRENGTHENING THE ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

A. ARIFA Scholarship Test (AST)

To encourage the academic performance of the students, the institute will conduct "Arifa Scholarship Test – (AST)" for Grades V to IX every year on the following day of the last annual exam. The test will be in the form of MCQ for 60 marks. Questions will be asked from the completed portions in Science, Mathematics and English. The outstanding students will be awarded as details follow: Fee concession worth Rs. 10,000/- (First Prize), fee concession worth Rs. 7,500/- (Second Prize) and fee concession worth Rs. 5,000/- (Third Prize).

B. NEET, JEE Foundation

a. The students for NEET-JEE Foundation (NJF) batch (Grade VI-X) will be selected based on their performance in the entrance test conducted by the school at the

beginning of the academic year. Three attempts can be made by a student (inclusive of AST).

- b. On selection the student will be charged a fee of Rs.10000 annually (excluding the regular school fees.
- c. To follow up the academic performance of the NJF batch, students will undergo performance tests every fortnight.
- d. On selecting the NJF batch, parents need to fill the form which will be issued on the first week of June.

COMPULSORY WITHDRAWAL

The Principal holds the right to withdraw compulsorily any student at any time without giving any notice, on disciplinary grounds. In such cases, the entire amount of annual fee shall be forfeited, irrespective of the date of such expulsion.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

If a parent wishes to withdraw their ward at the end of the academic year, they should submit the requisition letter for Transfer Certificate to the Principal on or before 31 March of the academic year. If TC's are applied after the deadline, I term tuition fee must be paid. No T.C. will be issued before the results are announced.


GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Communication in English is a must within the school premises.
- 2. A student should attend the class punctually, if by chance he / she comes late an entry has to be made in the page allotted for late attendance in the handbook and the signature of the Principal, or other persons authorised, to be obtained before entering the class.
- 3. Persistent late comers will be sent back home. It is essential to have 80% attendance for promotion.
- 4. No leave or absence will be granted except on written application of the parents addressed to the Principal in advance. Students with 100% attendance will be rewarded.
- 5. Students should be attentive in class, complete all assignments on time and bring necessary books for class work regularly.
- 6. Damage done to furniture, library books, sports goods, lab equipments etc. must be paid by the respective student.
- 7. It is forbidden to write or scribble on the wall, desks, throw paper or ink in the class room.
- 8. Students are responsible for the safety of their activity equipment. If left in school, must be kept under the charge of the class teacher/the activity teacher concerned. The school cannot be held responsible for the loss of any equipment left in the school bus or in any place in the school premises.
- 9. A student should be tolerant and respectful to others and must participate in all the activities of the school as per the school curriculum.
- 10. A student should always be neatly dressed in school uniform with shoes polished and hair properly groomed.
- 11. Students must refrain from keeping long nails and using nail polish.
- 12. Students carrying mobile phones and electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited on the campus. If a student is found with any gadget, it will be confiscated.
- 13. Students are not allowed to wear any jewels of high value, if it is found missing the institute will not be held responsible.

- 14. Students are expected to keep the campus clean and tidy. They must take good care of the property and material of the school. Any damage done either intentionally or by negligence will result to a payment done at school.
- 15. Library books should be handled carefully. Perfect silence should be maintained in the Library.
- 16. Students are expected to be polite and respectful while addressing the staff members.

GUIDELINES – ABSENTEEISM / SICKNESS

- 1. Students who are sick are advised to stay at home. In case of prolonged absence, the school must be informed within two days. In case of illness, a medical certificate is required to be submitted at the time of re-joining.
- 2. After an absence, a student shall be given opportunity to make up for the missed out syllabus / assignments. It is the student's responsibility to make up for missed assignments. Parents must help their child in completing the missed assignments. They can do so by personally writing it for the child.

- 2. If a student is involved in any malpractice in any exam, T.C. will be issued

GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

1. Parents are asked to take note of the homework given, check that the homework is done

before their wards are sent to school the next day. Parents must take a note of circulars sent

and act in accordance.

2. Parents must ensure that homework, learning for tests and the submission of work must be

completed in the given time. It must be the child's work and not done by the parents, if

found no marks will be allotted.

3. If Homework, Class work, Week-end activity and any other assignment are not done on

time, strict measures will be taken.

4. Parents must check the conduct and discipline record given in the handbook of their ward

daily.

5. A parent must attend Parent teacher's conferences and school functions. It is essential for a

parent to keep track of their child's progress in academics as well as his / her performance in

activities. Parents are thus advised to interact with the teachers only on the specified date..

6. Parents are requested to check the daily test notebooks of their child and sign them

regularly.

7. Parents must also keep a track of the tests and assignments and sign the test papers of the

child.

8. No child will be given extra tuition without the prior permission of the Principal.

9. No child is allowed to take tuition from any teacher employed by the school within the

campus or outside the school without prior written permission.

10. Parents and guardians are not allowed to go to the class rooms at any time to meet their

children or teachers. In case of any emergency, they should approach the Principal and

obtain the necessary permission.

11. Parents are requested not to call up teachers at their residences.

12. Parents can meet the Principal and teachers as per the schedule below.

- 14. Formative assessments will be done throughout the year. Assessments will be sent as reports to parents from time to time which should be duly signed, taken note of, and returned to the school promptly, failing which will not be admitted into class.
- 15. Credentials (Username and Password) for school app and credential cards for XSEED Universal app (KG V) and Karadi Path (KG III) has to be kept safe.
- 16. For Terminal Examinations parents are requested to collect the progress reports of their children positively on the dates given in the circular sent to them.
- 17. Students, when taken to fieldtrip should be in full school uniform.
- 18. Students can celebrate their birthday by presenting a book to the library or a plant to the School garden. Avoid sweets. **Students are encouraged to two questions to the Principal on their birthdays**.
- 19. Parents are requested not to give any kind of compliments or cash to the faculty and other personnel who are employees of the school.
- 20. The latest school information will be sent to the parents through newsletters. Parents are expected to be aware of all the school activities.
- 21. Parents are requested to take necessary care at home to ensure that the child is well groomed and dressed neatly before coming to school.

- 26. Parents should avoid planning outings and pilgrimages on schooldays. They should see that their children are present on the reopening and closing days of each term and on examination days.

- 27. Parents must ensure that the student's books and notebooks are wrapped neatly with brown cover and labelled.
- 28. Parents are asked to encourage their ward to communicate in English at home also.
- 29. If a student misbehaves or fails to do his/her duty regularly, it will be noted in the Students' Observation Record.
- 30. In case of any complaints about their ward and if a parent is called, he / she must come to school on the specified day without fail.
- 31. If there is a need of Change in Address / Phone No. / Transport and Requesting for Bonafide Certificate, it must be sought through a form (available in the school office) duly signed by the parent / guardian in advance of the actual date of change. **Note: Please collect the appropriate form from the school office.**

ORDINARY WAYS TO HELP YOUR CHILDREN TO BE EXTRAORDINARY

- 1. Review your children's textbooks so that you know what they are learning at school.
- 2. Reinforce what children are learning in school by having them to teach you their newly learned skills.
- 3. Praise their efforts not just their accomplishments.
- 4. Stress positive values caring, loyalty, trust, honesty, respect and responsibility.
- 5. Make the children to cultivate the habit of reading newspaper and discuss the current events with them.
- 6. Show that you are interested in your children's lives by asking about school, their teachers, friends, and listening to what they tell you.
- 7. Give your child undivided attention. Remember that you can't compensate for your absence with gifts.
 - "Being there for your child all the time is the best gift you can give to him / her"
- 8. Engage in a physical activity as a family.
- 9. Know what is in your children's school records. Ask for clarifications: voice concerns.
